<b>The purpose of data processing</b>	Identification of persons enjoying the EU right of free movement during border checks.

<p>A person with the EU right of free movement may choose to use the ABC gate when entering Hungary. Before using the ABC gate, you may find information about the conditions of access to the checkpoint. On the one hand, the data page of the travel document will be scanned at the place of the check, which data will be checked pursuant to Section 91/K (1) of the Rtv. in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) the central aliens policing register,</li> <li>b) the warrant registration system,</li> <li>c) the travel document register,</li> <li>d) the personal data and address register,</li> <li>e) the road traffic register,</li> </ul>	

f) the Schengen Information System,

g) the minor offence registration system, and

h) in the records available in the INTERPOL FIND network database, and on the other hand

during the check, a camera placed at the checkpoint will compare one-to-one the facial image of the person enjoying the EU right of free movement with the photograph in his/her travel document. If the check in the registers indicates that the entry conditions are met and the facial image comparison shows that the identity matches, the system automatically decides to admit the person with the EU right of free movement to Hungary.

During border checks using the ABC gates, the data are processed only until the facial image comparison has been carried out, after which they are immediately deleted and accordingly no further processing takes place, so the following **rights of the data subject** are not applicable:

- **information request,**
- **rectification,**
- **completing incomplete data,**
- **erasure of data processed,**
- **restriction of data processing or**
- **the right to data portability.**

If the data subject considers that the processing is in breach of the provisions of the relevant regulation or that the processing of his or her personal data by the police data processing unit is prejudicial, he or she should contact the data protection official with the complaint. All complaints will be investigated.

**To protect your data, you have the right to apply to the courts, which will rule on the case out of turn.
